Notice under National Electricity Law



The Australian Energy Market Commission (AEMC) gives notice under the National Electricity Law as follows:

Under s 95, the Australian Energy Council has requested the *Transparency of new projects* (Ref. ERC0257) proposal. The proposal seeks to increase the transparency of new projects and improve information provision in the National Electricity Market.

Under s 95, the Australian Energy Market Operator has requested the *NEM information for project developers* (Ref. ERC0260) proposal. The proposal seeks to allow a developer to register as an intending participant for the purposes of building a generating system or an industrial load, despite such a person never intending to register as a market participant.

Under s 95, Energy Networks Australia has requested the *TNSP exemptions from confidentiality requirements* (Ref. ERC0268) proposal. The proposal seeks to require transmission network service providers to publish certain information they have received from connection applicants regarding new and proposed connections.

Under s 93(1)(a), the rule change requests for ERC0257, ERC0260 and ERC0268 have been consolidated. The consolidated request is named *Transparency of new projects* (Ref. ERC0257). Submissions for the consolidated request are currently open and must be received by **23 May 2019** under the project code ERC0257.

Under s 43, the AEMC gives notice that the COAG Energy Council has directed it to review the System Black Event in South Australia on 28 September 2016 (Ref. EPR0057). The terms of reference and an issues and approach paper for the review are available on the AEMC website.
