



	Would retailers need to change their systems to accommodate the draft rule? What would these changes entail, both in terms of time and resources?	
	Does the reimbursement rate allow retailers to recover hedging costs? If not, how could it be improved? What other ways could impacts on retailer hedging be mitigated? Are there other costs that the rate should speak to?

	Will the option for any party (including retailers) to propose a baseline methodology be a useful measure? Are retailers likely to do so?	
	What are the impacts of the mechanism on retailers' ability to manage exposure in the wholesale market? Is there information retailers would need to manage these risks that they are not able to access under the draft rule?
