ARENA submission on the 'Efficient management of system strength on the power system draft determination'

This submission provides insights from projects funded by the Australian Renewable Energy Agency (ARENA) as relevant to the AEMC's current rule change consultation process.

ARENA is supportive of the suggested changes and welcomes the opportunity to make a submission to the process. The changes to the approvals process for new entrants should promote faster connections and take advantage of ever decreasing costs of new build renewables. This is likely to promote positive outcomes for consumers due to downward pressure on prices. ARENA agrees with the AEMC's suggestion that overinvestment leading to headroom of system strength is more desirable than underinvestment, which leads to delays in connection processes.

A number of ARENA projects are actively exploring the way different technologies, including synchronous condensers and advanced inverters, can provide system strength services, in particular the Powerlink and Monash University studies.

The table below lists two ARENA-supported projects that are relevant to the provision of system strength and that we expect may be technically capable of participating in the AEMC's proposed evolved framework for managing system strength.

Project name	Description
Monash University Stability-Enhancing Measures for Weak Grids Study	Researchers at Monash University will conduct a desktop study to explore issues and strategies associated with connecting inverter- connected plants such as batteries, solar, and wind into weak electricity grids. Initial results are due July 2021.
Powerlink Cost-effective system strength in North Queensland study	A study of enabling technologies to optimise the electricity supply system strength in north Queensland through building industry understanding of NEM rules, the connections process, and the local technical, economic and commercial considerations.
